Townsend Community School (TCS) is a conversion community school established in 2011. TCS is sponsored by the Margaretta Local School District. TCS accommodates at-risk students in grades 9-12. TCS offers college credit plus opportunities for all students. TCS maintains a safe and innovative learning environment in a modern facility. TCS allows each student to learn at their own individual pace.

As the sponsor of Townsend Community School, the Margaretta Local School District (MLSD) provides resources to support the school. Our relationship with TCS is a partnership to enhance an alternative educational delivery system targeted to improve student achievement. Our commitment is to offer "managed growth" to meet the needs for each student to be successful.

Townsend Community School Graduates



Since 2011, Townsend Community School has been enhancing the lives of its students through a flexible and alternative education. Townsend's highly qualified instructors and staff, their specialized curriculum, and their modern facility allows each student to succeed in his or her unique way. TCS believes that students come first. Furthermore, TCS believes that it is important for students to know what is important to their education.

TCS provides a safe and innovative learning environment that is designed to shape positive experiences for all students. Their accommodating and caring model not only motivates students to learn, but also allows students to access their education at their own pace, which in turn fosters the best version of themselves.



Townsend Community School is a conversion community school that provides a high quality education to its students. It contributes significantly to Ohio's effort to provide quality education options to at-risk children through vigorous, creative community-school programs that prepare students for the 21st century.

At Townsend Community School, the student body makeup is 3.29% African-American, 0.19% Asian, 15.09% Hispanic/Latino, 0.10% American Indian/Alaskan Native, 11.61% Multiracial, 69.63% White, 22.05% Students with Disabilities (IEP), and 68.08% who are Economically Disadvantaged.



Summary of Academic Performance

Townsend’s State Report Card for the 2022-2023 school year showed that Townsend received an Overall Rating of “Exceeds Standards”. Townsend received “Exceeded Standards” for the two categories of *Progress* and *Graduation Rates*. The school also received “Exceeds Standards” for the subcategories of *Combined Graduation Rate*, *5-Year Graduation Rate*, *6-Year Graduation Rate*, *7-Year Graduation Rate*, and *8-Year Graduation Rate*. Townsend received a “Meet Standards” rating for the two categories of *Achievement Component* and *Gap Closing*, and the subcategory of *4-Year Graduation Rate*. Below is the number of Townsend Community School graduates by school year.

Overall, Margaretta rates Townsend as Exceeds Standards in Academic Performance for the 2022-2023 School Year.

Fiscal Performance

Townsend Community School fiscal performance since its origin – 2011-2012 School Year – has afforded the School the opportunity to expand services to a great number of students. Townsend started in October 2011 with 27 students enrolled and a staff of three. At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year, Townsend had graduated 2,093 high school students since its origin. As of October 17, 2023 there are 517 students enrolled at Townsend. Margaretta reviews the financial reports monthly with the Treasurer of Townsend Community School and reports its findings to the Margaretta Board and TCS on a monthly basis. The financial review includes a review of cash statements, budgetary ledgers, check registers, revenue reports, enrollment reports, and the results are compared to the current forecasted results. The monthly reviews and associated financial reports are intended to provide internal financial controls and support for the financial



position of the community school. Margaretta also participates in the annual audit performed by the Auditor of State. The financial review process includes following up with recommendations of the Auditor of State and to address any deficiencies or citations. This is important to ensure fiscal stability and being able to meet the needs of the students. Total Margin of Operating Funds and Total Margin measurements are reviewed. This measurement evaluates Townsend on the relationship of revenue to expenses to determine if the School can sustain the educational program. Townsend has met the Cash Flow standards for the One-Year and Multi-Year analysis. This measurement evaluates the Cash position of the School. The 5-year forecast was approved at the May 2023 TCS Board and has been submitted by the Sponsor to the Epicenter.

TCS' financials are stable at this time, with the completed settlement agreement with the Ohio Department of Education.

Overall, Margaretta rates Townsend as Exceeds Standards in the area of Fiscal Performance for the 2022- 2023 school year.

Legal Compliance

Townsend Community School contracts with Amy Goodson Co., LLC for legal support. Margaretta Local Schools contracts with Pepple and Waggoner for legal support. Margaretta Local Schools contracts with Pepple and Waggoner for legal support. As part of its sponsorship of Townsend Community School, Margaretta conducted site visits and reviewed Townsend's Compliance with laws. Based on these visits and reviews, it was determined that Townsend is compliant with laws. Margaretta will continue to monitor and review Townsend's compliance.

Overall, Margaretta rates Townsend as Meets Standards in the area of Legal Compliance for the 2022-2023 school year.

Organization and Operation

Townsend Community School was opened under the Sponsorship of Margaretta Local School District on October 3, 2011. As of October 17, 2023, Townsend Community School's Governing Authority is composed of five members, Jean Smith (President), Israel Palomo (Vice President), Kent Edwards (Member), Dora Grant (Member), and Jacquelyn Sallee (Member). The Governing Authority has employed Ryan Bohn as Superintendent and Kelsey Kromer as Treasurer.

Townsend Community School operates as a Dropout Prevention/Credit Recovery Community School designed to serve students in grade levels 9 through 12 to attain a Tier I High School Diploma. Townsend assigns subject matter for a student based upon the student's capacity to



earn credits. Often they limit the student to one or two courses at a time. The student is provided with needed courses, and assigned the task of completing each subject. The student will have the opportunity to discuss with a teacher of record and meet with their homeroom teacher to assist the student in comprehension of the material. The student is to complete and pass all assessments of the subject matter with at least a 70%, thus determining that the student has demonstrated mastery of the subject and achieves a course credit toward the goal of graduation. Students are bound by the Department of Education rules for testing and accountability of instruction time. Instruction time is monitored by requiring students to complete 13 hours of in-person attendance at the school each week in addition to 13 hours online remotely. Course work is completed online and recorded through the school's Virtual Learning Academy platform through the Jefferson County ESC. Offline learning hours for CBI are uploaded into the Virtual Learning Academy platform by a CBI teacher. Statewide testing is administered by the School and offered in their facilities or at locations established by the School. Townsend leases a facility in Sandusky, and another facility in Fremont, for students that live in those areas.

In the 2022-2023 school year, 68.08% of Townsend Community School students were determined to be economically disadvantaged while 22.05% were identified with special needs. TCS offers Intervention Specialist services who are licensed plus highly qualified instructors who are the teacher of record for courses they are licensed to teach. The school works to provide each student with a customized Student Success Plan (SSP), a plan designed by the student, parent/guardian and instructor so the student can obtain their diploma. Included in the plan may be the utilization of the services provided by school psychologists, therapists and other related services. Students may choose the educational plan they will follow to obtain their high school diploma. Students choose TCS for a variety of reasons. The school provides these students and their families with educational alternatives. The school offers the student the opportunity to work at an accelerated and individualized pace, thus giving them every opportunity to succeed in their academic pursuits. Each student must meet the mandatory requirements established by the Ohio Department of Education to earn their high school diploma. TCS has received a rating of a Tier 1 diploma from the United States Armed Forces. The most recent data TCS has is that 2% of graduates enlisted in the United States Armed forces. The TCS charter was previously statewide, however an agreement with the Ohio Department of Education and Margaretta Local Schools now defines their enrollment boundary as students who reside in school districts located within Erie, Huron, Lorain, Ottawa, Sandusky, and Seneca Counties, effective October 1, 2020. The school has and will continue to be available to students from surrounding schools to offer an educational solution that would be best served in the alternative blended learning setting that Townsend Community School provides.

While at school, students work within subject specific learning labs, and have access to licensed teachers who provide instructional support and assistance. Students are also given access to



computers and the internet. To meet the attendance requirements, students must complete 13 hours of in-person attendance at the school each week, in addition to 13 hours online remotely, for a total of 26 hours of academic time per week. TCS also employs a CBI Coordinator and to assist students in earning credit for documented gainful employment and/or volunteer work. TCS will continue to investigate, evaluate and establish educational programs designed to best serve their unique student demographic. TCS strives to offer and maintain a safe learning environment conducive to learning for all students.

TCS continues to enroll new students on a weekly basis who are attempting to reach graduation. The school has grown simply by referrals from area schools, parents, students, and community members. The school works to promote high standards of education for all students. In addition, TCS encourages parent or guardian involvement. It is the ultimate goal of the school to increase student achievement in preparation for post-secondary education or career readiness. TCS employs a Success Coordinator and a Transition Coordinator to help students prepare for life after high school. The most recent data states 4% of graduates are engaged in a post-secondary college education. TCS works with other community organizations such as Erie County Business Advisory Council, Firelands Forward, Goodwill Industries, Job and Family Services, and Great Lakes Community Action Partnership to create job opportunities and work experiences for the students of TCS. It is the mission of TCS School to be an integral part of a valuable partnership with their students, their families and the surrounding communities. The school held individualized graduation ceremonies for their 2023 graduates and their immediate families at the school.

The TCS Governing Board has approved a Code of Regulations, fulfills its meeting requirements, maintains proper board meeting minutes, and has complied with Ohio's Sunshine Law. The foregoing were determined based on Margaretta's review and attendance at Governing Authority meetings, which it attends on a regular basis.

Additionally, Margaretta has determined that operations are consistent with the Community School contract as determined through the following:

- A. Ongoing facility visits, and meetings with students, faculty and staff, TCS changes in statute are reviewed with Margaretta's legal counsel Pepple and Waggoner. Townsend meets with its legal counsel Amy Goodson Co., LLC. Margaretta provides quarterly legal updates. Furthermore, TCS and Margaretta meet monthly to review attendance information and fiscal performance;



- B. Townsend Superintendent participates in periodic management meetings with Margaretta leadership;
- C. Joint meetings with the Superintendents, Treasurers, other Administrators, Governing Authority members and Margaretta Board members to discuss facilities and other strategic decisions that involve Townsend and Margaretta;
- D. Margaretta leadership attends professional conferences on Community Schools to obtain a better understanding of the community school movement. Margaretta receives Townsend agendas, meeting minutes, financial information, 5-year forecast, enrollment information and reports indicating the number of students enrolled who are defined as being “economically disadvantaged” and those who have been identified as having a learning disability.

Overall, Margaretta rates Townsend as Exceeds Standards in the area of Organization and Operation Governance for the 2022-2023 school year.
